History of the College

Viruddhachalam Thirumudhukundram is one of the most backward taluks in the Cuddalore district. Because of catering to the needs of the rural people residing in this area, Thiru Kolanjiappar Government Arts College was started in the year 1966. At first, the college started functioning on the Boys High School campus. The present area where the college is located in 43.5 acres which was given at a low price by Pazhamalai Nadhar Temple for the construction of the permanent building of the college.

At first instance B.A History and B. A Tamil Literature course was offered in the year 1966 with two Lakh Rupees endowment received from Thiru Kolanjiappar temple.

The college started in the year 1966 at Boys High School and was shifted to a permanent campus in July 1971. B.Com degree program was offered in the same year.

B.Sc Mathematics was started in the academic year 1972-73. B.Sc Zoology in the year 1979-80, B.Sc Physics in the year 1980-81 respectively. M.A Tamil was offered in the year 1981. M.Phil Tamil (part-time and full time) was began in the year 1993- 94. B.Sc computer science was offered from 1997-to 98. PhD Tamil was offered from 2000-2001 onwards. The college was accredited B+ in the year 2005 by NAAC. B. English literature, B.Sc Chemistry, M.Sc Mathematics and M.Com program were started in the academic year 2005 2006.

The shift system was introduced in the academic year 2007-2008 in the college. In shift I all courses was offered. B.A Tamil, B.A. English, B.Com, B.Sc Mathematics and B.Sc Computer Science were offered in shift II.

B.Sc Botany, M.A English was offered from the academic year 2012-13. M.Phil Degree was offered in the Department of History, Mathematics, Zoology, and Commerce from the academic year 2013-14. PhD, in commerce, was offered in the same year.

B.A Economics (English/ Tamil medium) and M.Sc., Physics were started in the same year. Our college was elevated to **Grade-1** by Tamil Nadu Government GO No:71 dated 23- 05- 2014. B.B.A, M.SC chemistry, M.Phil programmes in Computer Science, Physics and PhD, in Chemistry were offered from the academic year 2015-16.

The College was accredited **B (2.88 grade)** by NAAC in the year 2016. The Golden Jubilee of our college was celebrated in the academic year 2016-17.

Our College Emblem

Our College Emblem consists of an arched harp, fragrant flower and Pazhamalai Nadhar temple and the Divine javelin (spear) of Thiru Kolanjiappar at the backside. Each symbol conveys certain virtues for students.

The Divine javelin stands for the sharp intelligence that students should possess. The Temple symbolizes confidence, a superior attitude in students. The flower represents sweetness and fragrance that students should inculcate. The harp embodies that one should live in harmony with the music. Section-3

What is Ragging?

1. One or many students, using words, gestures, symbols or any other activity in an offensive way to tease and harass fresher or other students.
2. Causing physical or mental harm to new or other students
3. Forcing new or other students to do physical and shameful acts that no one else can normally do
4. Obstructing and disturbing the academic activities of new students
5. Senior students compelling new students to do their assigned academic works
6. Forcing other or new students to spend for them
7. Intimidating physical activity like sexual harassment (homosexuality, forced nudity)
8. Giving mental harassment through letters, email, phone, and social media to other students.
9. Distorting new students' mental health and self-confidence by showing off their authority and dominance

Section-7

Actions to be taken by The Principal

If a student is found ragged by others, it should be reported to the head of the Anti-Ragging Committee immediately. The same will be lodged to the police within 24 hours with or without a member of this Anti-Ragging Committee. And

documents will be prepared for the first information report (FIR). And the head of the committee will inform the district-level anti-ragging committee and the University to which the College is affiliated.

Section-9(1) Actions to be taken against ragging activities

The students indulging in ragging will be punished according to the nature and effects of their activities which will be investigated by the anti-ragging committee.

The punishment includes;

1. Suspension
2. Withholding of Scholarships or Benefits
3. Debarring from all exams
4. Withholding Results
5. Forbidden to attend any competition or sports events
6. Vocating from the hostel
7. Cancellation of admission
8. Suspension from one to four semesters.
9. Students expelled from one institution will be prevented from joining any other educational institution.

Mode of payment

1. Payment can be made only on college working days based on the time displayed on the notice board.
2. Tuition fees for each year must be paid in full within the first ten working days of the year. If a student fails to pay within the tenth working day of the year, a penalty of one rupee per day (excluding holidays) will be levied.
3. The student's name will be removed from the enrollment list if a student fails to pay within one month of the college opening after the holidays. If re-admitted the student should pay a fee of Rs.5. Student Attendance will not be issued for the intervening days from the date of removal from the name sheet to the date of payment and re-admission.
4. If a student leaves college in the middle of the year, the student will not be able to withdraw any of the tuition fees paid for that year.
5. If a student applies for a transfer certificate and conduct certificate, he will have to pay all the pay dues and penalties. A certificate will be issued only after the payment of dues.

Fee details

1. Tuition fees: Collected as per Government Order
2. Special computer training class is conducted for all first-year undergraduate (excluding computer science) students. The corresponding fee is Rs.700 / -
3. Model Examination Fee Rs.100 / Insurance Fee Rs.35 /

Thiruvalluvar University Attendance Rules

1. 181 days in an academic year are college working days.
2. 75 per cent and above Attendance Registration is needed to write University examinations.

3. Students who have got 65 per cent (55 per cent for pregnant students) and above but less than 75 per cent for attendance, have to pay condonation fees Rs.1000 to the Registrar, Thiruvalluvar University, Vellore – 5.
4. Pregnant students must submit a certificate issued by a government hospital DGO. After that, they will be permitted to write examinations.
5. Attendance of less than 50 per cent and up to 55 per cent will not be allowed to appear for the examination of that year. Those who have less than 50 per cent will be allowed to continue their studies. But he/she has to repeat the semester in the next academic year and they have to apply to the University through the Principal to rejoin the same class with the lowest attendance.
6. Science students should have 75 per cent of attendance for practical classes or else they will not be able to appear for their exams

CAREER GUIDANCE CELL

The career guidance bureau has been functioning vibrantly at Thiru Kolanjiappar Government Arts College with a Director and Members.

Its objectives are;

1. Informing students about employment details.
2. Preparing students to face employment-related competitive exams and interviews
3. Inviting various companies to the college to interview students and enable the eligible students to get placed.

Department of Physical Education

All students are members of the Sports Club. The sports committee includes a Principal (chairman), a Professor [Vice-Chairman] and Director of Physical Education (Secretary).

Also, a student member will be appointed as the General Captain of this committee.

National Service Scheme

Under the National Service Scheme Program, three units are Functioning in our college. The principal objective of this program is; to foster a sense of nationalism among students and motivate them to partake in social welfare activities. Interested students can join this program with the consent of the Principal and selected students will be permitted the NSS Activities.

National Cadet Corps

The force operates with 100 students and a faculty member. Selected students should undergo a medical test before joining this force. They will be trained on the college campus and elsewhere according to the training program. Students will be sent to eight different camps based on merit. Students will be sent for B and C exams at the end of the year.

Objectives

Objectives of the NCC are; cultivating leadership traits, moral sense, friendliness, and charity. Trained with discipline to create an army and protect the welfare of the country in times of crisis. Making students get attributes to become officers in Army, Navy and Air-force.

Adi Dravidar Welfare Department, Backward Classes

Welfare Department, and De-notified Communities

Welfare Department

The scholarship will be provided to students who secure 75 per cent and above of attendance during the last academic year.

Department of Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare

According to G.O No: 41, the annual income of the parents from 03.07.2013 should be below Rs. 2,00,000.

Those who exceed the income of above two lakhs are not eligible for scholarships. Only Special fees and examination fees are given as stipends.

Scholarship provided by the Department of Backward Classes Welfare, Most Backward Classes and Rehabilitation

There is no income limit for receiving this allowance. However students will be approved based on the attendance percentage provided by the students. Therefore, students belonging to this category must also attend 75 percent. Therefore, it is informed that all types of scholarships will be given only to the students who have 75% attendance. Tamil Way Incentives will be given in cash to college students.

Conditions:

1. The annual income of the parents should not exceed Rs. 2,00,000/-.
2. Must be a backward student.
3. Proof of being the first graduate student to come from a backward family should be provided by the Dashildar.
4. If the annual income of the parents is more than Rs. 2,00,000/- Scholarships are not available for Christian students who have converted to Adi Dravidar caste.

When calculating this income only the basic salary received in the previous financial year should be taken into account. To receive this scholarship, students must have completed 75 percent attendance in the previous year and the current academic year. Scholarships will not be awarded to students with low attendance percentage for any reason.

Details of various Scholarships offered by the
Office of the Director of College Education

1. National Eligibility Scholarship:

Government of India Scheme: / 11th Class 12th Class and Vocational College National Scholarships are awarded to a limited number of students in the State. SSLC students will be selected for this scholarship based on marks obtained in +2 and degree classes. The list of students' selected based on merit will be obtained from the selection committee.

The monthly Scholarship is given to the Students of the parents subject to the prescribed condition. Students of the parents who are not subject to the condition will be given a certificate of merit and a cash award of Rs.100 / - as a prize. If one who wants to get this scholarship should not have received any other scholarships. Annual income 30 per cent of the general deduction or Rs. 10,000 / - and the balance Rs. Should not exceed 12,000/-

2. Scholarship for freedom fighters:

Students of the Parents who were imprisoned for at least three months for the cause of fighting for India's independence are also eligible to avail of this scholarship along with the fee concession. This also applies to students studying in Arts and Vocational College.

3. Children of Army Veterans:

For children of current and ex-servicemen, conditional fee waivers and allowances will be provided based on certain rules and regulations.

4. Children of Sri Lankan Refugees:

Children of Sri Lankan refugees studying in Govt. College of Arts will be offered scholarships and Fee concessions subject to certain terms and conditions.

5. National Credit Grant:

This is a scholarship based on study qualification and prescribed qualification. The annual income of the parents should not exceed Rs 15,000/- Applications are invited each year through the announcement of popular dailies.

6. Intermediate (Ad Hoc) Scholarship Scheme:

Rs. 400/- will be given only to the underprivileged and proselytizing Christian first-year students who have passed in the first attempt by securing not less than 60% marks at the higher secondary level. There is no income limit for this scheme.

7. Stipend for Research

A research stipend of Rs 36,000 is provided by the Government of Tamil Nadu.

Note: Socially and economically marginalized students and scheduled tribes are exempted to pay fees for the purchase and registration of college applications to admit them to eligible courses. Moreover, the tuition fee is not levied at the time of their admission. Most backward classes, scheduled castes and scheduled tribes were exempted from remit tuition fees and special fees at the time of admission to the college. Scheduled caste students by obtaining community certificate from tasildhar and most backward students from deputy tasildhar respectively to be submitted to the college.

College Library

The College Library functioning on the ground floor of the College's main building with a seating capacity of 50 students to access reference books at a time. It also has separate sections for students to use such as the reading area, reference area and textbooks distribution area. The College Library has 47,000 books, and multinational e-books to suit the curriculum and to enhance the knowledge of the students. The library is being computerized by library software to modernize it. Separate departmental libraries are functioning in all departments.

Services provided by the college library.

1. Distribution and receipt of books.
 2. Accessing reference books in the library is available
 3. Internet facility is available.
 4. Central / State Government public examination books are available in separate racks.
 5. Employment and important news are notified immediately through the notice board.

 - Only one book will be issued for each library card.
 - Texts must be returned within 15 days from the date of collection. Students will be charged Rs. 2 / - per book per day after the specified day.
 - Students can return their books or library card when they leave the college and obtain a certificate of no-dues.
 - Students are not allowed inside the library without an ID card and usage of mobile phone is also prohibited.
